Health Services COVID-19 Situation Report Date 10/23/2020

Dear Community Members,

For the third week in a row, more cases were reported in Alaskans this past week than any previous week ever reported. Hospitalizations hit record highs last week also. Alaska remains on high alert level as we continue to see acceleration in new cases.

The Alaska Department of Health & Social Services Weekly Case Analysis Report provided last night for the week of October 11-17 describes how COVID-19 is spreading in Alaska:

How COVID-19 spreads in Alaska

- Most new infections among Alaskans are from community spread, not from travel. Most Alaskans get the virus from someone they work, socialize, or go to school with.
- Many cases do not have a clear source, meaning that contact tracers have not been able to identify
 where the person got the virus. This means that there are cases in our communities that we do not
 know about.
- Many Alaskans who are diagnosed with COVID-19 report that they went to social gatherings, community events, church services and other social venues while they were contagious but before they knew they had the virus.
- The distribution of cases among people of different races and ethnicities has not changed significantly since last week.
- Contrary to what has been seen in recent weeks, with the proportion of cases previously increasing most rapidly in Alaskans aged 10-39, the proportion of cases in Alaskans aged 40-69 increased slightly this week compared to previous weeks, although there were still higher numbers of new cases seen in Alaskans aged 20-39 than any other groups. This follows patterns seen in other states of increases in viral transmission occurring in younger age groups first, and then followed by increases in older age groups, after which typically an increase in hospitalizations and deaths is seen.

Alaskans should wear masks, stay six feet from non-household members and avoid indoor gatherings.

What's New?

COVID-19 Vaccine Planning- Both the IHS and State of Alaska submitted plans to the CDC in preparation for COVID-19 vaccine planning. As of today, a vaccine has not been approved yet by the FDA (the agency responsible for making sure vaccines are safe and effective), however some vaccines are in the final phase of testing. Local planning will be essential to effectively distribute the vaccine and we plan to start working with your tribal council in developing local vaccine distribution plans for your community.



^{*}We reported on 10/09/2020 that there were 13 Active Users at Chenega Clinic receiving the flu vaccine, but after further review one of the patient was a test patient so that patient was removed from the report.

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ANTHC COVID-19 Testing Site Relocated- As of October 15th, testing site has temporarily relocated to the Consortium Office Building at 4000 Ambassador Drive. This change is expected to last until plans are finalized for a winter testing site. Patients will now park, walk-in and wait inside for their nasal swab collection. Mask and physical distancing is being enforced.

Health Mandate 10: Interstate & International Travel - As of October 16th, updated travel mandates are in effect. This mandate addresses requirements regarding travel into Alaska. The changes keep protective protocols in place but are aimed at making rules simpler and easier to understand. - Clinic Services: Please don't delay necessary medical care during the COVID-19 pandemic. We are here to serve you. Call the clinic to schedule an appointment (currently not accepting walk-ins).
- **COVID-19 Testing**: We want to make it as easy as possible for you to get tested for COVID-19. Every Chugachmiut clinic has testing capabilities and adequate supply to support testing. It is vitally important to get tested at the first sign of any symptoms. Testing is our best tool for understanding virus transmission and risk in your community and to empower individuals to prevent the spread of the virus to others.
- **Flu Vaccine**: All clinics have flu vaccine! Call clinic to make an appointment to get your flu shot (for those 6 months and older).
- **Dental Services**: We understand your dental health impacts your overall health. Dr. Murphy remains on-call for any dental emergencies. Dental and hygiene services will be provided in Nanwalek & Port Graham on the following dates:
 - Dr. Murphy & Angela McKinney- Port Graham- 11/8 to 11/14 (service dates)
 - Dr. Murphy & Angela McKinney- Nanwalek- 11/15 to 11/22 (service dates)
